



CAHYA MATA SARAWAK BERHAD POSTS RECORD PROFIT

9-month pre-tax profit up 45% to RM269 million



26 November 2014 - Cahya Mata Sarawak Berhad (CMS) continued to deliver a strong performance in the first nine months of 2014 (PE2014). The Group recorded a pre-tax profit (PBT) of RM269.02 million for PE2014, a 45% increase from the corresponding period of last year's (PE2013) PBT of RM186.15 million. The PBT reported for the third quarter ended 30 September 2014 (3Q14) has also remained strong at RM104.18 million, a 67% increase from the preceding year's corresponding quarter's (3Q13) PBT of RM62.53 million and a 6% increase as compared to PBT reported in the second quarter ended 30 June 2014 (2Q14) at RM98.65 million.

Year-on-year, the Group's profit after tax and non-controlling interests (PATNCI) of RM177.39 million for PE2014 is 62% higher than RM109.73 million for PE2013. Earnings per share stood at 17.20 sen versus 11.04 sen* (adjusted for share split & bonus issue in June 2014) from the corresponding nine-month period of last year.

The main contributors towards the solid PBT earnings for PE2014 were the Cement, Construction & Road Maintenance and Construction Materials & Trading Divisions. The Cement Division recorded a PBT of RM92.42 million in PE2014, a 23% increase in comparison to PE2013's PBT of RM74.87 million. The Construction Materials & Trading Division reported a higher PBT of RM50.60 million for PE2014, exceeding PE2013's PBT of RM38.11 million by 33%. This was attributable to the increased business by its trading arm and also the recovery of bad debts. The Construction & Road Maintenance and Property Development Divisions also reported higher revenues and PBT compared to the corresponding nine-month period of last year.

Commenting on the results, Dato' Richard Curtis, Group Managing Director of CMS said: "CMS's success in recording strong performances in a challenging business environment is attributable to its prudent business model, professional management, and its focus on delivering long-term sustainable growth. Significant achievements have been recorded namely by the Cement, Construction Materials & Trading, Construction & Road Maintenance and Property Development Divisions, which saw robust rises year-on-year in PBT. Our third and fourth quarters are typically the strongest and based on the results for the first nine months of 2014, we can expect a strong financial performance for the full year of 2014 for CMS".

"We believe that CMS is one of the best proxy listed investments for Sarawak's accelerating economic growth. This is driven by the State's plan to promote energy intensive industries under the Sarawak Corridor for Renewable Energy (SCORE) initiative and consequently from the infrastructure and related services required across the State. These two drivers are set to propel the State's economy and GDP to new heights. CMS's 20% stake in the joint venture ferro silicon and manganese alloys smelter project with Australian listed OM Holdings Ltd and 40% stake in an integrated Phosphate Products complex with Malaysian Phosphate Additives Sdn Bhd and Arif Enigma Sdn Bhd - plus other investments being evaluated - are poised to significantly drive up shareholder value. Our strong corporate governance measures, healthy balance sheet and professional management team allow us to maximise our participation in the Sarawak growth story and position ourselves to ensure long-term sustainable growth", said Dato' Curtis.

KUCHING REACHES MILLION TON PRODUCTION MARK



The year 2014 proved to be a truly remarkable year for Cahya Mata Sarawak Berhad. As the Group celebrated its Ruby Jubilee, the Production team at its CMS Cement Pending plant was worked tirelessly to present to the group, a gift worthy to commemorate such an eventful year. As the sun set on the last day of the year, it was also the dawn of realisation for the team, as it achieved an astounding production amount of 1.025 million tons of cement.

Leaner maintenance planning and execution, lowered the breakdown hours which attributed to the plant's steadily improving reliability. Last year's plant utilisation factor peaked at 85.43%, higher as compared to previous years. Production process was fully optimised, coupled with steadily good clinker supply from CMS Clinker in Mambong enabled the plant to achieve high daily throughput. Not forgetting its responsibility to its consumers, the team worked diligently together with the Quality Department to ensure that the cement produced is of quality, on spec with Malaysian Standards, and on time to cater for the market's demand.

Reaching the elusive million for the first time since the plant's conception is a feat to be proud of, truly showing the maturity of the young team behind it, who were guided by able leadership of Mr Goh Chee Bing, Head of the Cement Division.

Moving forward, the team aims to further improve the plant utilisation, hoping to match 2014's success!

GOOD CORPORATE GOVERNANCE MEANS GOOD BUSINESS WORKSHOP



On 28 October 2014, Group Internal Audit staff led by Mr Francis Lou, Group Internal Auditor, conducted a workshop entitled "Good Corporate Governance Means Good Business" to raise awareness on good corporate governance practices, common fraud red flags as well as related controls.

According to MSWG Malaysia-ASEAN Corporate Governance Report 2013, from a survey of 862 public listed companies on Bursa Malaysia, 83% of those surveyed scored between 50% - 75% whilst 7% managed to score higher than 75%. These scores represent the level of compliance with recommended principles and best practices in corporate governance mainly covering rights of shareholders, equitable treatment of shareholders, role of stakeholders, disclosure & transparency, and responsibility of the Board.

Malaysian companies in 2013 had jumped to 76 points from 68 points from a year ago, signaling the companies have made

significant progress in improving their corporate governance practices and disclosures which is attributed to higher requirements imposed by the 2012 MCCG (Malaysian Code on Corporate Governance). There is a strong upward trend from 5 years ago when the average score stood at 66 points.

How does good governance add value? In essence, through good governance, sustained returns and ultimately increased value can be delivered to the shareholders or owners of a business and which can help to attract further investment. The principles of good governance touch on all areas of business and to be truly effective, they need to become an integral part of the way the company "does business" and help to keep the directors, managers or any persons of concern out of jail.

In addition, good corporate governance is essential for fraud prevention.

Tips To Avoid Fraud

- Conduct on-going employee training to enhance fraud awareness.
- Employee training on ethics and conduct.
- Establish an effective internal audit function
- Involve independent parties.
- · Segregation of duties.
- Involve an authorised committee.
- Prevent tender award decisions based on a single person in authority.
- Verification of vendors.

CMS Safety Month Campaign provids an excellent platform for all Safety Officers and HSE personnel as it provides them an avenue to display their roles as in-house trainers.



Wonderland Wows Audiences at Tunku Putra School





With this, the CMS Friendly Games has finally come to a close for 2014 and we hope to see everyone again in 2015!






ORGANISE YOUR DIGITAL LIFE

Why do you want to use Evernote? Do you really know how to use Evernote? There is a lot to be said, but one things for sure, its been probably one of those rare apps I have opened my wallet to pay for a premium subscription. For years I've craved for an app where I can keep everything organised, allowing me to share information with people whilst on the go. Some of you are probably already using it, I just want to share what you can do with it.

I have been using this app since 2008 and today its truly become my digital brain. And I am finding new uses for it everyday.



In this post, I want to share eleven ways to use Evernote you might find useful, and perhaps, even surprising.

- 1. Keep your medical records. I keep my doctors' names and contact information, medications and vitamins, surgeries and illnesses in a single note. This comes in handy whenever I go to a new doctor.
- 2. Subscribe to email newsletters. I don't need more information cluttering up e-mail inbox, so I subscribe using my Evernote email address. (You can find this under Evernote | Account Info.) The newsletters get funnelled directly into my database.
- 3. Take a photo of your printer cartridge. I buy this infrequently enough that I can never remember my printer model, let alone what cartridge I need. With a photo, I can quickly reference it at my local office supply.

- 4. Save important email messages. I generally file all my email messages in a singular archive folder. However, occasionally, I want to save a message related to a specific project. I simply forward it to Evernote and add the appropriate tags.
- 5. Collect reader and listener questions. I still write for a lot of digital publications and occasionally get reader queries, my editor just drops these queries into my evernote email box, into a dedicated notebook for just these requests.
- 6. Maintain a packing list. I hate getting to my destination and realizing that I forgot something. That's why I maintain a comprehensive packing list in Evernote.
- 7. Snap pictures of your shopping list. My wife frequently makes surprise inclusions to our shopping list, and because I am either driving when I get the call or really busy, she just drops them into Evernote. I should never have taught her how to use Evernote.
- 8. Clip web pages to read later. Whenever I come across an article or post I want to read later, I use the Evernote Web Clipper for Chrome. I add a "read later" tag, that way I can get to these clips with a simple saved search. When I have read it, I remove this tag.
- 9. Collect items for meetings. I create a tag for each upcoming meeting. It includes the date and a brief description (e.g., "2014-07-11 - CTC Meeting 17"). Then, as I create notes about the meeting or receive emails, I simply tag them. I can then sort the tags by name to put them in date order.
- 10. Character Recognition. Evernote has its own OCR (Optical Character Recognition) service which means that it can read text, whether it's computer keyboard text, text in a PDF document, a photocopy of some text (say a page of a book) or even text in a photograph.

If you are in a photo, standing in front of a truck that says "Cahya Mata Sarawak Bhd" (for example), or any other identifying marks, Evernote's OCR function will read the words "Cahya Mata Sarawak Bhd" (or whatever else it finds) and make those words searchable in your account.

11. Leave Voice Notes. Evernote allows you to leave voice notes which are also searchable. Using the smartphone apps you can speak your note into the phone, and the note is then saved in your account and synchronized to all other instances of Evernote that you have installed on your computers and smart devices.

This hardly scratches the surface, but hopefully, it will stimulate a few ideas. The more you use Evernote, the more useful it becomes, and you don't even need a Premium plan for to exercise its potential.








* CMS team accepts ALS Ice Bucket Challenge

September - November










