# CMS pre-tax profit up 12%

26 February 2016

CMS reported a total revenue of RM1.79 billion and pre-tax profit (PBT) of RM381.65 million for the financial year ended 31 December 2015 (FY 2015). The PBT has increased by 12% in comparison to the preceding year's (FY 2014) result, the PBT increased by 12% and the PBT for the fourth quarter ended 31 December 2015 (Q4 2015) is reported at RM115.37 million.

Year-on-year, the Group's profit after tax and non-controlling interests (PATNCI) of RM241.59 million for FY 2015 is 9% higher than the RM221.34 million reported for FY 2014. Earnings per share (EPS) stands at 22.69 sen versus 21.42 sen from last year.

The main contributors towards the PBT earnings for FY 2015 were the Construction & Road Maintenance (RM135.29 million), Construction Materials & Trading (RM107.99 million) and Cement (RM103.17 million) Divisions.

Commenting on the results, Group Managing Director, Dato' Richard Curtis said: "Last year and the period leading into this year has been challenging for us in terms of Group performance meeting targets. This is largely due to macro factors outside our control which include, amongst others, low commodity prices and the higher cost of raw materials and of imported cement resulting from the strong U.S. dollar in the Cement Division. Within Sarawak however, the continued focus on the State's infrastructure has resulted in strongly improved PBT results from our Construction & Road Maintenance and Construction Materials & Trading Divisions. With a commendable performance recorded in 2015, we remain cautiously optimistic that this positive momentum in our core businesses can continue."

CMS' dividend policy provides for a net payout ratio of 40% of its annual consolidated PATNCI to shareholders subject to a minimum of 2.0 sen per share. This is subject to the level of available cash and cash equivalents, return on equity and retained earnings, projected levels of capital expenditure and other investment plans. For FY 2015, although CMS turned in a stronger performance, the Board is proposing, in light of the above factors, a final dividend of 3.0 sen per share tax exempt (single-tier), for shareholders' approval at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting. Together with the interim (single-tier) dividend of 1.5 sen per share paid on 22 October 2015, this represents a payout ratio of 20% and brings the total dividend pay-out for FY 2015 to 4.5 sen or an amount of RM48.35 million payable to shareholders (FY 2014 PM20 43 million)

# MPAS inks PPA with SEB

3 February 2016

Malaysian Phosphate Additives (Sarawak) Sdn Bhd (MPAS) signed a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Sarawak Energy Berhad through its wholly-owned subsidiary Syarikat SESCO Berhad, to power the largest integrated phosphate additives plant in South Fast Asia.

Located in Samalaju Industrial Park (SIP), the plant will have an annual production capacity of approximately 500,000 MT of food, feed and fertiliser phosphate additives, 100,000 MT of ammonia and 900,000 MT of coke.

Using rock phosphate as its major raw material, its range of phosphate additive products will serve as the feedstock in the production of various foods and beverages, in Halal animal feed by replacing the use of animal bones and in the production of NPK fertiliser.

MPAS' Managing Director, Mr Lim Lee Wan said, "This plant is just the first phase of a long-term plan for our 350-acre land parcel. With its use of proven technology in its manufacturing processes, we are confident that we will

see not just downstream manufacturers setting up near us but even more significantly that it will serve as the catalyst for SIP to evolve into one of the region's major phosphate chemical hub."

Construction of the plant will commence following the formal signing of the EPC construction contract and financial close, both of which are at an advanced stage with production ramp up scheduled to commence in the first half of 2018.





#### Kipali Interchange Pilot Project

23 February 2016

The State Government of Sarawak implemented the Design and Build and Negotiated Contract to propose the construction of the Datuk Temenggong Abang Kipali bin Abang Akip Interchange (Kipali Interchange) via the Shallow Underpasses so as to ease traffic congestion at the roundabout.

Deemed a 'pilot project', the proposed scheme is implemented to study the effectiveness of the proposed shallow underpass system before the Government considers adopting the concept for other traffic improvement works such as congested junctions and roundabouts in Kuching.

The scope of works includes the design, construction, completion and commissioning of the Kipali Interchange, underpasses structure, drainage and ancillary works.

The RM67.0 million contract sum project commenced on 26 November 2015 and is estimated to complete two years later, 25 November 2017.

#### **SACOFA**

# enters into agreement with U Mobile



Present at the signing ceremony was SACOFA's CEO, Sudarnoto Osman, Managing Director, Mohamed Zaid Zaini, U Mobile's CEO, Wong Heang Tuck and Chief Technology Officer, Too Tian.

On 29 April 2016, SACOFA Sdn Bhd signed an Infrasharing & Bandwidth Leasing Agreement with U Mobile Sdn Bhd at the Pullman Hotel Kuching. With this partnership, SACOFA will deliver built-to-suit-sites and provide bandwidth leasing services to U Mobile over a period of 10 years. The contract value for the towers is RM2.7 million per annum and for the fibre-leased line at RM1.3 million per annum.

SACOFA currently has a telecommunication infrastructure footprint of more than 700 sites (including base stations) throughout Sarawak, in addition to its 4,000-km on-land fibre network that stretches from Kuching to Lawas and into the neighbouring countries of Sabah and Brunei.

CMS has a 50% equity stake in SACOFA.

4 February 2016



Endorsing Roald Dahl's quote, Principal of TPS, Susan Holmes cited, "If you are going to get anywhere in life, you have to read a lot of books". She explained that World Book Day was established to develop and cultivate students' love of reading. She encouraged students to find

time to read every day and parents to read to their children and talk about it with them as frequently as possible.

"As well as assisting their children to make some wonderful character costumes, parents were also very actively involved in making, donating and selling an array of different cakes for the themed bake sale outside the library, which raised funds to support increasing the number and variety of books in Primary and Kindergarten classrooms 'reading corners.' The students clearly enjoyed the special treats during break and lunch time", she added.

Students in the International Primary Section were also excited about the stories they successfully crafted for the school library. Adopting the teacher-guided writing activity, each class wrote a paragraph and then passed it on to the next one for them to replicate the process until an end product was conceived.

A selection of characters such as the Dork Diaries, Grimm's Fairy Tales and Star Wars were also on hand to help with the handover of the donations of household items, food and cash, which were generously contributed by the families of TPS to support needy families in Kuching and surrounding areas who had been affected by the recent flooding to Hope Place.

Other activities that resulted from the hard work and commitment of the TPS staff and students included starting the day with a story in every class, having the opportunity to dress up as their favourite characters and admire others' ingenuous costumes, entering the photograph competition, adopting the Drop Everything And Read (DEAR) initiative and playing Traditional Tales-themed Pictionary.

In May 2015, a scandalous affair rocked arguably the world's most popular sports. The world of football is said to generate the highest income in television revenues and as such hosting the game becomes extremely profitable. To guarantee these profits, many indecent proposals have been made and accepted which eventually led to the indictment of many officials in the FIFA ranks on the eve of its congress where a presidential election was due.

Since these events came to light, it is evident that processes to provide assurances on governance and practices in one of the biggest global organisation had failed. In short, there is no evidence to suggest the existence of an internal audit function in FIFA.

According to FIFA's 2014 Governance Report, their Compliance Unit is a unit "... to which FIFA has entrusted its compliance function, assuming responsibility for risk assessment, the Internal Control System, internal audit tasks, and compliance management tasks." This unit is overseen by the directors of the Finance and Administration and Legal Affairs Advisory divisions. On paper, the Compliance Unit appears to possess within its scope and authority "unrestricted rights of access and investigation of any organisational unit of FIFA". This may not be optimum, but this unit could have fostered a degree of oversight on compliance, controls, and risk management, but most likely did not.

This very much suggests that the single most outstanding weakness in FIFA's governance and control is the lack of an independent internal audit function dedicated to exclusively carry out internal audit missions. A unit that combines compliance management tasks with internal audit functions is well short of models in the modern organisational world which should exist in FIFA. The internal audit function of detecting weaknesses in internal controls, and providing reasonable assurances should not be combined with any other functions to enable the internal auditors' ability to objectively and impartially provide such assurances on the effectiveness of internal controls. This however is very unlikely to have existed in FIFA.

## RED CARD FOR FIFA

should now very quickly establish within its ranks an internal audit function that is independent of any other functions so as to give it the scope and authority to have "unrestricted rights of access and investigate any organisational unit of FIFA". This shall provide the organisation with a watchdog function, and further down the road continuous improvements the controls within organisation in the effort of dealing with better corporate governance, fraud prevention and compliance, and transparency.
